Pakistan is among the list of countries where infectious diseases are still causing health hazards and are contributing to the high fatality rate. Pakistan has the second-highest prevalence of Hepatitis C and stands on number four in drug resistance tuberculosis cases and eighth among the countries which bear 95% of the burden of infectious diseases. This is quite an alarming situation and our healthcare system is still unable to cope with this.

Infection Prevention and Control Foundation believes that "Prevention is better than cure". This is basically the motivation that drives us to work harder each day. The foremost purpose of the IPAC Foundation is to aware and educate the general public about all the possible



preventive measures against infectious diseases.

We started this venture with only 100 volunteers but now we are a force of more than 2000 active volunteers who are working across Pakistan. IPAC Foundation was formed with the goal of imparting education and training to healthcare workers to prevent the spread of infections in healthcare facilities maintaining international standards and guidelines for prevention and control.

But unfortunately, there is no such facility available in Pakistan that trains health care providers on such necessary grounds providing detailed guidance, equipment, and field exposure.

01 Community Health Program

Viral hepatitis is the eighth highest cause of mortality around the globe. Over 400 million people are carriers of Hepatitis B, while an estimate of 58 million people have chronic Hepatitis C infection. In Pakistan, almost 12 million people suffer from hepatitis B or C. Each year brings about 150 000 new cases due to inadequate prevention, testing, and treatment resources. Early detection and timely treatment can help mitigate the burden of disease.

Through these Hepatitis Screening and Vaccination camps, VFAHT aspires to screen masses for hepatitis B & C, and also provide vaccination against hepatitis B. These camps also double back as a source of disseminating awareness about the disease and advocating preventive interventions.





The centers will be equipped with advanced quality medical supplies and machinery. Patients can get specialized consultation, lab tests, medicines, x-rays, treatment, and vaccination. All of these services will be available in the centers free of cost.

Our First Facility

Chiraghdin Infectious Diseases and Community Health Center

We inaugurated our first center in Kashmiri Mohalla, Sialkot named as Chiraghdin Infectious Diseases and Community Health Center in December 2021.

The project of revamping & renovation of an ancestral Havelia named Chiragh Mahal turned into Chiraghdin Infectious Diseases and Community Health Center, is donated by the Chiraghdin Family as a gift for the people of Sialkot. This initiative is taken to cleanse Sialkot of the dangers of these fatal infectious diseases. The facility provides free and quality healthcare services along with patient education and counseling regarding infectious diseases in Sialkot and surrounding rural areas. It also houses a community hall in which preventive healthcare programs will be held.
